Routines

Maths

- Children are taught in their own class for maths.
- Usually start with a recap activity.
- Main teaching focus.
- Apply skills.
- Guided group to extend or support where necessary.
- Plenary reinforce/recap.
- Pupils are guided to choose their own level of challenge using a mild, spicy and hot system.
- The school is in the process of creating some help videos for the website - watch this space.

Times Tables



This year the government have introduced the Y4 times tables check. It will take place during July (a similar format to the Y1 phonics screening).

It tests the pupils' recall of their times tables from 2 to 12.

It is computer based - pupils can use iPads, laptops and some with have adult support to type if required.

They have 6 seconds to answer each question.

The results of the assessment should be sent home on the end of year reports.

PLEASE DO NOT PANIC!

We are doing lots to prepare your children for this.

We have taken part in a trial and a pilot of this government initiative.



Times tables

- Baseline assessment to find out where the pupils are at following the 6
 week break.
- Based on this we will set differentiated speed grids.
- 4 levels depending upon their ability with either 60 questions, 84 questions or 132 questions each week.
- · Timed 6 minutes.
- Each week the children will be expected to learn their times tables, focussing on the ones they struggle with.
- TT Rockstars at home will support this too.
- Each week the children's scores will be put into their reading records, along with their spelling scores.
- Once 100% achieved pupils will move up through the speed grids.
- Once completed pupils move onto Mind Bender Challenges and mental maths questions.

English - writing.

- Focus on a different genre or writing style every two or 3 weeks.
- Look at models W.A.G.O.L.L.
- Skills based work S.P.A.G. embedded.
- Use supported writing models and Talk for Writing strategies.
- Marking for improvement and verbal feedback given - identify areas for support.
- Time given to improve and edit work.
- Independently apply the skills learnt in a piece of long writing at the end of each unit.

English - reading.

- Assess reading ages at the start of the year.
- Interventions set up for pupils who require support. (e.g. daily readers).
- Reading scheme and free readers.
- Pupils can read books from the library, class or home these can go home to be read.
- · Guided reading and comprehension skills -weekly.
- Reading challenge termly challenge linked to our topics (similar to the year 3 system).
- There will be a choice of reward at the end of each term for classes - e.g. adventure trail, film, laptops, PE etc.
- Homework expectation read daily and reading record must be filled in or we will assume the children are not reading.

The chart below shows the impact reading at home for just 20 minutes every night can have. It is staggering the difference just 20 minutes per day can make.

Y4 Spelling

- Your child will be bringing home a copy of the spellings for year 4 for the entire year inside their reading records. Some children will have a separate differentiated list where required.
- We have one weekly spelling session in class to focus upon spelling patterns, homophones and words with prefixes and suffixes. This is linked to our spelling list each week.
- The homework expectation is for the children to learn their weekly spellings from the list. They can have a go at finding other words with similar spelling patterns at home too if they wish.
- The pupils will be tested on some of these words at the end of each week, through dictated sentences. We might also include an extra word that fits the spelling rule/pattern!

Homework Expectations Recap

- Reading every night to be recorded in the reading record.
- Times tables the children must spend some time learning their tables each week.
- Weekly spellings to learn using a variety of methods (which are all available on the website). These will be stuck in their reading records.
- The reading challenge to be completed each term. There is an expectation this year that the children's final piece is about their entire reading challenge journey. This could be a booklet, PowerPoint, vlog etc.

Expectations for Year 4 pupils.

- Greater independence working walls, class dictionaries, speaking to adults/parents if there are problems etc.
- Develop a greater sense of resilience and maturity - playground, friendships etc.
- Always putting in 100% effort.
- High expectations of presentation and behaviour.
- Polite, kind and courteous behaviour follow the school values of honesty, friendship, kindness, respect and perseverance.
- Always smartly dressed in correct uniform (labelled please).

Rewards and Sanctions

Rewards

 Stickers, house points, behaviour ladder, star of the week, head teacher awards, deputy head awards, excellence awards, proud badges and share good work with other classes and staff.

Sanctions

- Behaviour ladder, warnings, isolated learning within class or within the year group, missed minutes from playtimes and lunchtimes.
- Sent to Phase leader (Miss Wilce), Deputy head (Miss Baker) or Head teacher (Miss Gobell) as appropriate.
- Parents informed as appropriate.

Provision Maps

- Children will receive differentiated provision based on their needs.
- If your child needs any extra provision or intervention, this will be shared with you at parents' evenings and on reports.
- Most children's need will be covered through quality first teaching strategies used in class.


